And do pay *all his* Debts and Legacies so far as *his said* Goods will Extend and Law shall bind *them* if also *they* do Exhibit into the *Dean & Chapter* Court at York, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Rights, Credits, Cattles, and Chattels of the said Deceased, and do make a true and just Account of the same when *the said Parties* shall be thereunto lawfully called. And moreover, if need require enter into further Bond, with more sufficient Sureties for the Performance of the Premises as the Judge of the said Court, for the Time being shall think requisite and Needful. And lastly, do save, defend, and harmless keep the above named Judge, and all his Officers, and Ministers, against all Persons by reason of the Premisses. Then this present Obligation to be void, and of none Effect or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
